## Class 1 Hazmat Awareness for EMS

This course was designed to allow emergency responders to meet those requirements as set forth in the OSHA Regulations and promulgated by the EPA. The regulations state that all emergency responders must have annual refresher training to maintain their competency or must demonstrate their competency to their employer at least annually.

*Instructor: SFMTD, No PPE required*

**Class Limit: 50**

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## Class 2 Propane Emergencies

This course is designed to increase fire fighter awareness of hazards and operations when dealing with propane. Classroom session contains discussion on scene size-up, tactical considerations, fixtures and safety devices, incident management, physical and chemical properties of propane, BLEVE, evacuation distances, and flow requirements for cooling tanks. The hands-on Session deals with simulator tank, establishing water flows, managing resources, and safely controlling propane incidents.

*Instructor: SFMTD, Full structural PPE and SCBA required, all participants are required to be clean shaven prior to the start of class.*

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## Class 3 Introduction to SCBA

In this course, students will learn to identify hazardous respiratory environments encountered in firefighting and identify the requirements, limitations, and safety features of the self-contained breathing apparatus. Class will include hands on use of the SCBA in a controlled Environment.

*Instructor: SFMTD, Full Structural PPE and SCBA required, all participants are required to be clean shaven prior to the start of class.*

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## Class 4 Grain Rescue

This course provides the knowledge and skills required to perform a Grain Engulfment Rescue, It covers the skills and knowledge required to rescue a victim engulfed in grain. This course requires a basic knowledge of confined space rescue techniques as well as knowledge of lockout/tag-out procedures as prescribed by OSHA and other regulations.

Removal/rescue from grain bins and hoppers, grain bin cutting procedures, entrapment prevention and hazards of working in and around grain storage facilities are also addressed in this course. Removal of victims from locations requiring high-angle rescues is not covered in this course due to the advanced nature of those procedures, however completion of basic rope rescue is recommended.

*Instructor: SFMTD, Long pants and shirt with sleeves, hard hat/helmet, eye protection, clean gloves and hard soled boots required.*

**Class Limit: 35**

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## Class 5 Legal Smorgasbord

This class will answer questions, discuss concerns and address matters of interest to Rural Board members, Firefighters and Municipal Officials. Participants may bring discussion topics to class.

*Instructor: Jim Egr, NSVFA Legal Counsel, No PPE required*

**Class Limit: 40**

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## Class 6 Working with the Media

Adapted from FEMA's IG-290 curriculum, this course provides rural first responders with skills needed to communicate with the public through the media. The class examines roles of the media and the rural first responder/public information officer. Participants learn how to give print/electronic media interviews, write news releases, provide information at the scene, and how they fit into the joint information system.

*Instructor: Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium, No PPE required.*
